**Camping by the River**

Joshua 3

**Following the King...**

Exodus 19:10 • Joshua 3 • Psalm 23 • 2 Timothy 2:21 • Hebrews 12:2

Starts by **BREAKING CAMP** and **WASHING HANDS**

Means **FIXING our EYES** and **POINTING our FEET**

Requires that we **Walk** at **HIS PACE**

Often times is more like **WADING IN** then **DIVING IN**

**As we walk don't forget!**

Joshua 1:5-9, 3:15-17 • Colossians 1:15-18 • Revelation 1:7-8

Jesus went **BEFORE US** and He promises to come **AFTER US**

**(in'ter-sēkt') –To cut across; to overlap each other**

*That's the goal of the word of God: to cut across and overlap into our everyday lives.  
Use these questions to help you dig deeper and personally apply what you're learning.  
We also use these questions as a framework for discussion in our small groups.*
